

Student Built House To Be Auctioned Off

A house built by carpentry students at Southern Nevada Vocational-Technical Center (Vo-Tech) will be sold at public auction along with four student-built storage sheds at 9 a.m. on Saturday, July 29.

The house, built from scratch as an annual project of the class, contains three bedrooms, and one-andthree-quarters baths. The structure has 1,424 square. feet of living space. The minimum bid price is \$24,900 which represents the cost of materials used to build the house.

The house is rough wired and plumbed and has all heat and are duct work installed. The structure is fully insulated and exceeds code requirements.

Other features include finished ceilings, complete interior trim, custom built loak cabinets, and complete flooring which exceeds code requirements.

Each storage shed, eightby-ten-feet, has a minimum bid price of \$495.
