A goal has been set to increase the current membership rolls to one thousand new and/or renewed N.A.A.C.P. memberships from August 1, 1989 to December 20, 1989

All N.A.A.C.P.'ers and friends are requested to enter this mass campaign and participate as individuals or groups in writing adult memberships. The success of this campaign depends upon the commitment that you have made to yourself and to your children's future.

A financial inducement of "dollars for memberships" has been established to encourage more participation. The campaign has been divided into four divisions, plus a bonus.

The highest number of memberships written in each division will be declared as the winner. The winners will be announced at the Executive Committee meetings on 8/8, 9/12, 10/10, 11/14, and 12/12 at 7:00.
