The National Drug Policy Network was created to make sure that all sides are heard and debated before a national drug policy is unleashed.

The organizations and individuals of the National Drug Policy Network offer a variety of solutions. We come to the table with different game plans, but there are certain principles we all agree on:

We cannot solve this

problem by declaring a civil war on ourselves. Simply arresting the users and sellers is not the answer. It is far more cost effective to attack the disease and not the symptoms. The reasons for drug use and abuse cut deeply into the fabric of our country. The answers lie in medicine, psychology, religion, history, education, and lastly, law enforcement.

Massive education is the most effective route to prevention. It is obvious we can no longer scare our children into drug abstinence. We need to spend the money necessary to reach our

children in thousands of different ways. We can no longer ask them to "just say no".

The Constitution should not be a victim in the drug way. We cannot legislate away dealers or drugs. In a desperate attempt to solve this problem, let us be careful not to distort the Constitution.

This is a time for healing society, not a massive purge.

The "Bennett Plan" will be officially released on Tuesday evening, September 5th, when President Bush delivers a nationwide television address.
