Stronger Church-College Link Urged At Higher Education Day

Re-establishment of the strong linkage between black churches and higher education institutions was urged by top black college officials at an annual religious service and college symposium at the Metropolitan African Methodial Episcopal Church four blocks from the White House in the Capitol.

Dr. Prezen Robinson, president of St. Augustine's College in Raleigh, NC, and

Dr. George K. Goodwin, executive director of the White House Initiative on Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), were major guest speakers at the church's observance of Higher Education Day during regular Sunday services and a reception-symposium later.

Emphasizing the need for greater education and training for skilled employment for black youth by the year 2000, Dr. Robinson pointed out that one third of all American workers and 50 percent of all students will be minority members. He called upon black churches to help prepare students for higher education in the future as they have in the past before the desegregation decisions.

Approximately 100 educators attended last Sunday's symposium to consider the recommendations of Robinson and Goodwin for improvements in HBCUs.
