A number of the nation's four adverse civil rights rulings by the Supreme Court this year and called on Congress to pass remedial legislation overturning these decisions. Thus, it will confront many of the critical social and economic problems afflicting Black America and concentrate attention on programs and policies that have been proven effective in addressing them, according to Dr. Benjamin, L. 
