

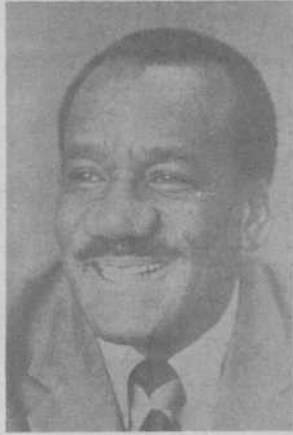
## Westside School Alumni Association Profiles Program Officers

This is the first in a series of profiles of key program officers and committee chair persons who will serve the association on the community during 1989 and 1990.

The association which was organized in 1988, is a non-profit organization and is in the process of organizing several programs designed to serve the senior citizens, the need, the handicapped and the youth of the Las Vegas community. A list of these programs will appear in future articles by this writer.

One such committee or program is a scholarship committee which will provide financial assistance of needy persons entering or attending a trade or technical school or college. The chairman of this committee is H.P. Fitzgerald, and the career education and training counselor for the scholarship committee is Henry J. Moore. Our first profile will be that of Henry Moore, association career education

counselor. More will serve as education counselor for all scholarship recipients prior to leaving for their training or educational institution.

HENRY J. MOORE, SR. -ASSOCIATION COUNSELOR- Moore, a native of the state of Wisconsin, graduated from the university of Wisconsin, Alabama State University, and Fisk University. He was awarded a fellowship to attend Stanford University in California. Moore majored in chemistry and physics, and taught in those fields at Western High School, Clark High School

and Hyde Park Junior High School in Las Vegas. He was the department head of the Chemistry and Science Department at Clark and Western High School, and a counselor at Western High School for several years.

While teaching and coaching at the Westside Elementary School, Moore coached the Westside School Rams Track, football, and basketball teams to several state championships, and one tri-state championship between 1947 and 1953,

making him the winningest coach in Southern Nevada during this period.

Along with his teaching and coaching services in Wisconsin, Alabama and Nevada, Moore was a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Elks, Shriners, Masonics, Nevada Retired Teachers Association, Valley View Golf Club, Physics Teachers Society, Chemistry Teachers Society, and many other clubs and organizations.

Moore is married to the former Deborah Crockett, a veteran Clark County educator and counselor, and they have two children, Henry J. Jr., of Las Vegas and Vera Walker of Reno, Nevada.

### Eighth Black Reparations Tribunal Exposing U.S. Counterinsurgent Attack On African Community And Conditions Of Genocide

The Eighth Reparations Tribunal for African People in the U.S. is slated for Washington, D.C. The Tribunal promises to bring out dramatic testimony on the U.S. Government Counterinsurgency Attack on the African community and its relationship to the conditions of African people in the U.S. today. A key witness will be Frederika Newton, widow of former Black Panther Party leader Huey P. Newton. Fredericka will testify on the August 1989 U.S. assassination of Huey P. Newton. Other testimony will demonstrate that the murder of Huey is part and parcel of the J. Edgar Hoover-led counterinsurgency of the '60s which was designed to attack and wipe out the Black Revolution and its leadership.

In addition, African people from throughout the U.S. will come forward to testify about the specific nature of the Counterinsurgency in our community -- in the form of the U.S.-imposed drug economy in the African community and the so-called "war on drugs" that provide a cover for the government's blatant violations of the National democratic rights of the African community.

Ward Churchill, an activist in the American Indian Movement and author of the recently-published Agents of Repression and COINTELPRO Papers, will give further evidence on the government's murder and assassination plots against the African and Native American freedom struggles in the U.S.

Junis Wilson, chairperson of the African National Reparations Organization, said in calling this Eighth

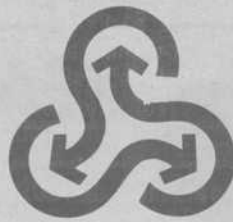
