Oprah Winfrey Takes Top NAACP Image Award-

Oprah Winfrey, queen of the daytime talkshow circuit and co-producer and star of the TV movie "The Women of Brewster Place," was named Image Award entertainer of the year Wednesday by the Beverly Hills Hollywood branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

Sammy Davis Jr., Ruby Dee and Ossie Davis were selected for induction to the Image Awards Hall of Fame.

Begun 22 years ago to encourage more black participation in the whitedominated television, movie and recording industries, the Image Awards joined the ranks of televised network awards programs three years ago when NBC began airing the tape awards presentation. The Dec. 9 award ceremony at the Wiltern Theater in Hollywood is scheduled for broadcast on NBC Jan. 6.

Wednesday included the President's Award, to go to Motown Records President Jheryl Busby; the Roy Wilkins Civil Rights Award, to go to Rep. Ronald V. Dellums, D-Calf.; the Key of Life Award, presented posthumously to Rep. Mickey Leland, D-Texas, who died this year in a plane crash in Ethiopia; the Jackie Robinson Sports Achievement Awards, to go to Olympic gold-medalist Jackie Joyner-Kersey; and Corporate Award, to go to Digital Equipment Corp.


