WBC WON'T Accept Mavericks Agree to **Leonard's Decision**

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico -The World Boxing Council has rejected Sugar Ray Leonard's attempt to give up his super-middleweight title.

"I received Leonard's resignation, but I did not accept it," WBC president Jose Sulaiman said Friday in a telephone interview from Mexico City.

A letter from Mike Trainer, Leonard's lawyer, said the boxer was resigning the title because other boxers were pressuring Sulaiman to give. them a chance at the crown. The letter said Leonard was not quitting boxing.

The Mavericks agreed to waive Dantley, obtained last year in a trade for Mark Aguirre, the day after the current season ends.

Dantley's contract, a 4year deal he signed in November of 1987, would have run through the 1990-91 season.

Barnes Sentenced To Prison


