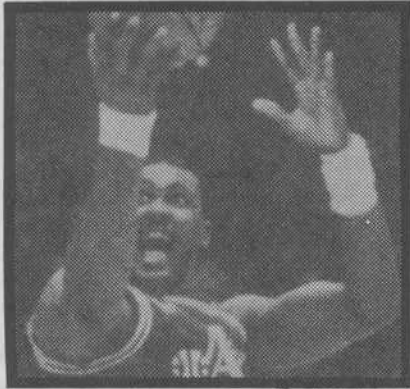
## Malone Named As All-Star Reserve

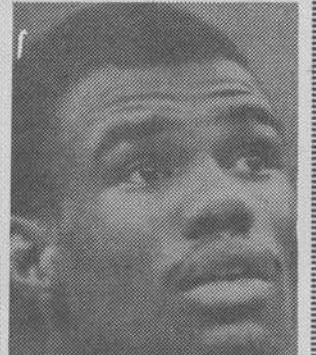
### South Africa Sports Boycott May End

## Rebels Climb Back To Ninth

### Lady Rebels Remain Third

Missouri, Kansas and Arkansas held their spots atop the Associated Press' College Basketball Poll this week, while UNLV jumped up three spots to ninth.

Missouri and Kansas head into their rematch on Tuesday with just one loss each.

The Tigers (21-1) held on to their No. 1 ranking for the third week in a row, after knocking Kansas (22-1) from its two week hold on the top spot.

UNLV, despite recent problems with unpaid hotel bills and fights on the court, manhandled both Utah State and San Jose State to claim their No. 9 ranking.

In the women's poll, UNLV remained No. 3 behind Louisiana Tech and Stanford.

The Lady Rebels had an easy time with San Diego State to up their record to 19-1.

Meanwhile, both Louisiana Tech's and Stanford's records remained perfect at 19-0.
