Foreman Enters Race for Title



After that we want to fight Mike Tyson again. Douglas' manager said he had not talked about a possible fight with Foreman.

However, Johnson also said that if negotiations for a Holyfield and/or a Tyson rematch broke down, that would leave the Douglas camp with no choice but to look for other fighters.

Johnson also stated that a Douglas-Foreman fight would be on about the same level as a Douglas-Holyfield bout.
