It was indeed fitting that during the course of "Black History Month'' this year the music industry payed tribute to one of the true legends of our time. Marking the 25th anniversary of his passing (February 15. Capitol Records 1965). released a special 20-track compact disc by Nat King Cole under its Collectors Series featuring many of the classic recordings that earned the superb song stylist and musician his place in history

The National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (NARAS) also honored Cole. one of its founding members. with a Lifetime Achievement Award at the 1990 Grammy Awards on February 21st.

Such recognition of Nat King Cole's immense contribution to music is particularly gratifying to Maria Cole, the wife of the internationally-acclaimed entertainer. ''If Nat were alive today, I really believe that the kind of music he sang and delivered would have still been popular. His music has always had that evergreen, perrenial quality.''

Indeed, interest in Cole's work has never waned and the impact he made with his smooth, warm and distinctive vocals can be heard in the style and approach of
