"California Suite" premiered in Los Angeles and broke all records before moving to Broadway, playing for 445 performances in New

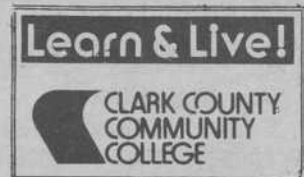
production stages.
