Could this be UNLV's Year?

Top seeded and second ranked UNLV managed to outrun and gun Loyola Marymount 131-101, to gain the final berth in this week's Final Four showdown in Denver.

The win gives the "Runnin' Rebels" their third Final Four appearance in the school's history, and their second in four years.

They will take on Georgia Tech, who captured the Southeast Regional Championship over 20th ranked Minnesota.

The Yellow Jackets (28-6) are led by the high scoring trio of Dennis Scott, Brian Oliver and freshman sensation Kenny Anderson, who some consider one of the best point guards in the country.

Anderson, who was named regional MVP, kept the Jackets in contention with a disputed shot at the buzzer in the regional semi-finals against Michigan State.

UNLV, on the other hand, has really come on strong in the tournament due in large part to the outstanding play of Stacey Augmon.

Augmon, who last year was named the Big West Conference MVP, first team defensive All-American, and a preseason pick for first team All-American this year, has been overshadowed by the strong inside play of forward Larry Johnson. Johnson was named first team All American last week.

But Augmon, not surprisingly, has come alive during the tournament, and has proven that he is still both offensively and defensively one of the best collegiate players in the country. He was named the West Regional MVP on Mon-

Combine Augmon and Johnson with screaming center David Butler and you have perhaps the best front line in college basketball today.
