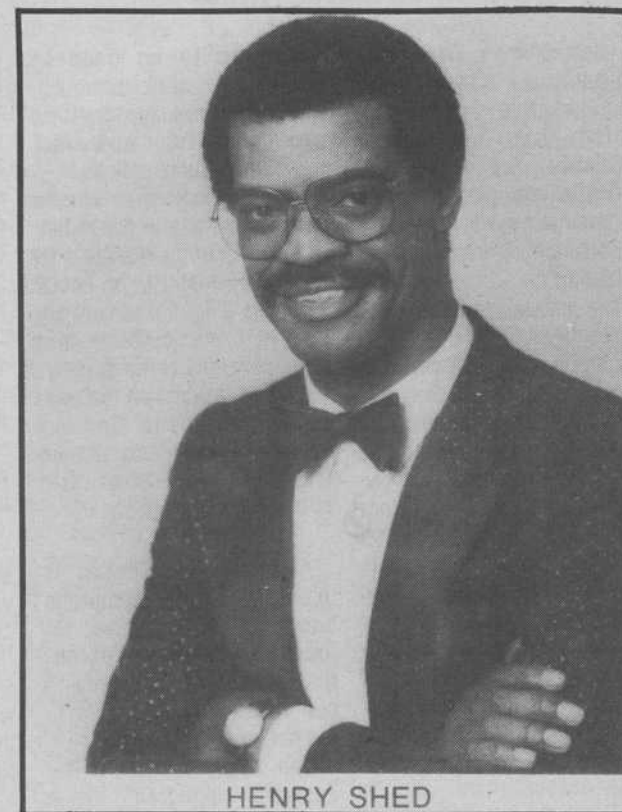
## HENRY SHED AN INSTITUTION IN CASBAR LOUNGE
