titude should be questioned.

The Sentinel-Voice interviewed Matthew Wallace, Director of CCSD Transportation Department Wallace was asked about the school district's policies and the allegations surrounding this incident.

"The sole purpose of the Department of Transportation's school buses is to safely transport children. That is our job," said Wallace. He said the incident was untinely and unique to the district, which has over 5,000 stops per day.

First of all I want it to be

known that the school district does not condone any driver leaving children stranded, no matter who they are, and the driver in question was clearly in the wrong. I want to emphasize, however, where the problem stemmed from. The busdriver was told by a Safety Patrol Officer in that jurisdiction to leave those kids if they were not in a straight line. This is not the district's policy and the Safety Officer had no authority to tell a busdriver what to do. The busdriver, being new, was not familiar with the procedure," said

'We make 5,000 stops per day and we have never had this problem...The Safety Officer and the busdriver are being consulted and the situation is being reviewed.

Concerning the allegations of verbal abuse and pulling the bus onto the desert to frighten the children, Wallace said he was puzzled as to why all of these allegations are surfacing at this time when there was no mention prior to this event. He said that due to the nature of these allegations, he would do a more "extensive investigation" to resolve the matter

"I have no intention of putting the friver on another route due to a single incident. We would have to deal with the union and the district in order to justify that. But I will see to it that this incident never happens again." he said.

Reliable sources at the CCSD Transportation Department has informed the Sentinel-Voice that there was a second unreported incident of another busdriver choking a student while trying to stop a brawl on the bus. We are following up leads on this story for our readers, but to date there is no conclusive

The parents of the students involved in this incident said that they had not taken action previously against the district prior to this incident. because the situation had not gotten this far out of hand

Sources have also informed us that there have been numerous discriminatory practices in hiring since

Wallace's tenure began 8 years ago. We are following up these leads as well for future presentation.

The parents of the students said they are not going to back down until the driver is reaaaigned and that the school district should tighten its orientation procedures so that this will not occur again.

I am sure that they will We'll have to wait and see. And in the meantime, all eyes will be on bus number 89825.
