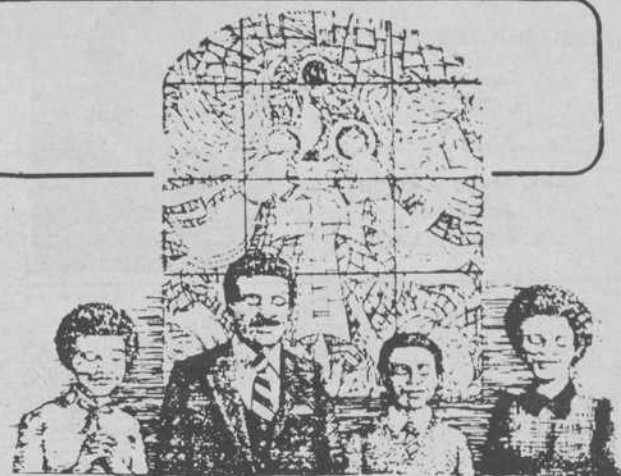

### PRAYER POEM

The magnificent prayer poem, "Crown Him With Many Crowns," befits the text "Thou shalt ... be a crown." The majestic words were written by Edward Peronet, a close friend of Charles and John Wesley. The most popular tune was written by an American lawyer and musician, Oliver Holden, who lived near the site of the Bunker Hill monument in Boston. Holden's gifts were such that he was asked to write the triumphal ode for George Washington's visits to the Old State House in Boston. The organ that was used to play the Coronation hymn is still in Boston's Old State House.

A devout Baptist and ardent worker for the Church, Holden's last words were, "I have some beautiful (musical) airs running through my head, if I only had strength to note them down."

### There's Still Time To Return Your 1990 Census Questionnaire

If you haven't mailed back your 1990 census questionnaire, there's still time to do so.

"Though April 1 was officially Census Day," explains Census Bureau Director Barbara Everitt Bryant, "we can still accept completed questionnaires because our computers will be able to log them in before we create the list of households not returning the form."

Over 88 million census forms were mailed to households on March 23 and another 11 million were delivered directly to households by census personnel for mailing back. All Census questionnaire packages contain an instruction guide and a postage paid return envelope.

Anyone needing assistance completing their form may call a toll-free number--1-800-999-1990--and receive help. The hearing impaired may call 1-800-777-0978 for TDD assistance.

Starting in late April, an army of follow-up census takers will visit those households that yet have not returned their questionnaire.

borrowed money, rather than balance the budget, stimulate productivity and educate the population.

That's why Americans used to worry about the health of the President of the United States. Now we worry about what the President of the Bank of Japan had for breakfast. That's also why one morning at breakfast when he decides, for whatever reason, that the American junkie will not get his/her \$150 billion fix of yens, the dollar will fall out of bed.

There will be a sudden drop in the dollar's exchange rate which will precipitate a shortage of capital which will jump-start an escalation in American interest rates.

The result would probably

be a combination of recession and depression, resulting in a 10% drop in the standard of living for the average American. For the poorest, the decline would be horrendous - 50% upwards.

What does all of this have to do with African-American people? First of all, African Americans would be the hardest hit - no more social programs with food and rent "safety nets" and no more affirmative action for the African-American middle class.

Already the U.S. government allows the Japanese to locate their American factories in Caucasian suburban and rural areas and to restrict hiring to a 25-mile radius. By definition that is institutional racism - oppression based on a factor (geographical proximity) indirectly related to race.

It doesn't just hurt African-Americans. While these American factories hire mostly Caucasian workers for the low-paying work, the high-paying design and engineering jobs are created for Japanese in Japan. Because of America's economic failure to compete, we have created 4 million jobs for Germans and Japanese in Germany and Japan. That's worth loaning the U.S. \$150 billion a year at high interest rates.

But 8 million Americans lost their jobs or went from \$20-an-hour employment to the minimum wage at fast food restaurants. The White House and Congress are either co-conspirators or unwitting economic imbeciles who are tolerating racist business practices from the
