Tyson To Fight At Caesars

NEW YORK — Mike Tyson's first fight since losing the heavyweight title will be against Henry Tillman on June 16 in Caesars Palace at Las Vegas, Don King Productions announced Tuesday.

Also on the card will be former heavyweight champion George Foreman against Adilson Rodrigues.

Tyson, 37-1 with 33 knockouts, was the undisputed heavyweight champion when he was knocked out in the 10th round by Buster Douglas at Tokyo on Feb. 12. Douglas plans to defend the title against Evander Holyfield in September.

Tillman, 20-4 with 14 knockouts, is perhaps best

known for twice beating Tyson during the 1984 Olympic trials.

DeWitt vs. Benn Championship Fight Moves to Caesars Atlantic City

The Doug DeWitt vs. Nigel Benn World Boxing Organization middleweight title bout originally scheduled at Caesars Palace in Las Vegas has been moved to Caesars Atlantic City. The fight date is Sunday, April 29.

The card, which had included World Boxing Association light heavyweight champion Virgil Hill in a title defense against Australian Guy Waters, was rescheduled after Hill suffered a fractured thumb while sparring.

The revised April 29 fight card will include two North American Boxing Federation title bouts. NABF light heavyweight champion Andrew Maynard, from Laurel, Md., is scheduled for a 12-round defense. Maynard, a

1988 Olympic gold medalist, has a professional record of 11-0, 9 KOs. Also set for a 12-round title bout is NABF light flyweight champion Michael Carbajal, of Phoenix, Ariz. Carbajal, Olympic silver medalist in 1988, is also undefeated, with a record of 13-0, 7 KOs.

Welterweight contender Robert Wangila, 1988 Olympic gold medalist, and middleweight Chris Sande, 1988 Olympic bronze medalist, will fight in separate six-round bouts. Originally from Kenya, both fight out of Las Vegas.

Opponents for Maynard, Carbajal, Wangila and Sande have not yet been announced.

Las Vegas Boxers Advance in Gloves

Three Las Vegas boxers won championships at the 1990 Regional Golden Gloves tournament at the Golden Gloves Gym Sunday.

Joey Smith, 16, defeated Sergio Gonzalez of Arizona, 5-0, at 106 pounds; Dino Salcedo, 23, defeated Dennis Weaver of Arizona at 1:05 of the third round at heavyweight; and Mark Connolly, 30, defeated Paul Hirsch of Arizona at :37 of the third at super heavyweight.

The trio will join the other nine winners at the national

championships in Miami starting May 7.

Smith is a four-time state champion who recently lost at the U.S. Amateur Boxing Federation tournament in Colorado Springs, Colo. Salcedo, a bouncer in a local bar, recently moved here from back East and is coached by former world welterweight champion Fred Hernandez.

This will be the fourth trip to the nationals for Connolly, an employee at the Landmark Hotel.

76ers And Pistons Set Record For Fines

NEW YORK — The NBA levied a league-record \$162,500 in fines Friday and suspended three players for one game in the aftermath of a bench-clearing brawl between the Philadelphia 76ers and Detroit Pistons.

Each team was fined \$50,000 by NBA Commissioner David Stern for failure to control its players.

"At some point, teams must be held accountable for the conduct of their

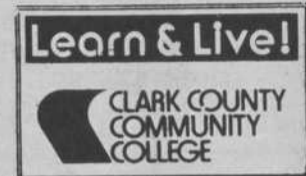
players," Stern said in a statement.

Detroit's Bill Laimbeer and

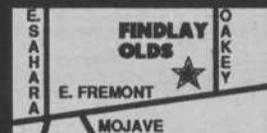
Philadelphia's Charles Barkley, the main participants in Thursday night's brawl, each were fined \$20,000 and suspended for one game. Detroit's Scott Hastings was docked \$10,000 and also suspended for one game.

The NBA also fined Detroit's Isiah Thomas \$7,500 for throwing two punches at Philadelphia's Rick Mahorn in an earlier incident that resulted in Thomas' ejection with less

than four minutes remaining. In addition, five players on each team were fined \$500 for coming off the bench during the last-minute brawl.

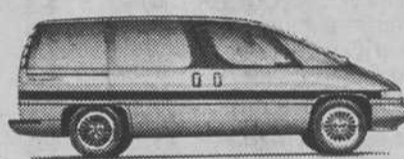
