The following are excerpts from Mrs. Coretta Scott King's 1969 (and still priceless) book, "My Life priceless) book, With Martin Luther King, Jr."She speaks of the Malcolm X that she and her husband came to admire.

The book was published by Holt, Rinehart and Winston. Today, Mrs. King is the Founding President and CEO of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change in Atlanta.

During the five days they (Dr. King and Rev. Abernathy) were in prison, Juanita (Abernathy) and I went to Selma to see them and to participate in the struggle. The day we arrived at Brown's Chapel for a noonday mass meeting, Andy Young came up to me and said, "You're going to have to come inside and greet people, because Malcolm X is here and he's really roused them. They want to hear from you.

I said, "Andy, I'm just not in a speaking mood.

He said urgently, "You must do it. By the time you get inside, you'll feel like

Juanita and I went into the church and were enthusiastically received. Juanita spoke first. Then I gave a short inspirational speech, emphasizing the non-violent approach and urging them to continue. After I spoke. I was introduced to Malcolm X for the first

The Head Start program was created in 1964 under the Economic Opportunity Act. Project Head Start was enacted as part of President Lyndon B. Johnson's War on Poverty. Reports indicated that children of families living in poverty were more likely to suffer from health and nutrition problems, and had a lower level of educational performance than their higher income peers. The initial pilot program was created to help 100,000 children, over the summer months, who entered school in the fall of 1965. However, the project generated so much interest in communities nationwide that over 500,000 children were enrolled in the program that first year

Head Start provided services to improve the social and learning skills and the nutritional health status of economically disadvantaged children before they enter Programs must provide for a range of services including: medical dental, and social services. parental involvement, and educational programs and

Studies have been conducted to determine the effectiveness of Head Start. The results of these studies indicate that children who

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receive educational and other services in the Head Start preschool program demonstrate improved academic and learning achievement.

Parental involvement is required in various aspects of the program. Many Head Start parents volunteer to with operating programs and about 30% of Head Start staff are parents of current or former par-Head ticipants. Start programs may be based at centers or homes, so that families may receive services in their homes. Programs must provide for interaction between Head Start staff and families of participating children.

Although Head Start is one of the most effective federal programs, it only serves about 17-18% of eligible low-income children. Hundreds of thousands of children are on waiting lists for Head Start programs. While it is evident that the current budget deficit has made federal funds scarce, Head Start is an example of a good return on an investment. We hear so often how important it is for children to receive education and nurturing in the critical early years. If we believe this statement, then we should commit the necessary resources to expand the Head Start program to assist all those who are eligible. Undoubtedly, it will be one of our nation's wisest invest-
