POTPOURRI: - It seems to me that Stanley Kramer has attached the wrong title to his upcoming flick about the exploits of the African-American soldiers in WW-II. If memory serves me correctly the derogatory title, 'Eleanor Roosevelt's Niggers," came about because of her interest and defense of the Tuskegee Airmen. It became their label after she flew with one of the accepted Airforce pilots to their training grounds at Tuskegee. As usual, it appears that this good intention filmmaker is on the same track as many other white producers at the helm of 'Black movies' by getting his information from uninformed sources. This effort, particularly with Robert Guillaume on board as executive producer, could create the same impact as Kramer's "Home of the Brave" and "The Definat Ones." We suggest he search out the correct people for the right information, in what could be a timely and meaningful screen fare...After much trial and tribulation, 'King," an English musical version of the saga of the immortal Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is on stage in London. Based on the critic's attitude, it should never have happened: It's the brainchild of British composer-conductor Richard Blackford. Maya Angelou also contributed. The non-acceptance of the critics has seemingly justified their fears. Here's how one critic summed it up, and we quote, "Rich singing and an insipid book sum up "King," the controversydogged musical about Martin Luther King, Jr.'s leadership of the civil rights struggle in America.
