

UNLV's Tanya Davis and Billie **Butler Ready for National Track and Field Championships**

Tanya Davis, in her fourth year at UNLV, and Billie Butler, a junior, are ready for the National Track and Field Championships which will be held in Durham, North Carolina June 2nd and 3rd.

Davis, the school record holder in the 55 meter and 100 meter hurdles (13.49) was an All Big West performer her junior year, and earned All-American honors as a Sophomore as a member of the 4x100 meter relay team at the NCAA outdoor championships. As a freshman, she set the school record in the 100 meters and 400 meter hurdles (13.46, 60.13) and was the Big West champ in the 100 meter hur-

Butler, leaping 41'8" in the triple jump, is ranked 13th in the U.S. and 22nd in the world. As a sophomore, she earned All Big-West honors in the triple jump and placed 3rd in the long jump.

The Rancho High School Allgraduate earned American honors by Track and Field, and also played basketball for the Rams.
