St. John Church Opens New Child KING COMMITTEE Care Center In West Las Vegas

The St. John Church of God in Christ announces the opening of the St. John Child Care Center, 2301 Comstock Drive, on June 11. A gala open house was held at 10 a.m., preceded at 9:50 a.m. by a dedication service led by Reverend O.L. Jefferson. pastor of St. John Church.

Attendees included representatives of construction-related businesses and individual donors who helped make the child care facility a reality. The center serves children ages two through five. Operating hours are 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The child care facility is non-denominational and is open to the public. Weekly, daily and hourly child care rates are provided. Families with more than one child enrolled in the center will receive a discounted rate for each additional child.

According to church official Clester Nelson, a full balanced breakfast, lunch and afternoon snack will be provided to each child at no additional cost. Nelson. chairman of the board and business manager of the center said, "I am concerned about the need for affordable and safe child care service for those families in my community who cannot afford to pay \$60 to \$75 per week per child for child care service. This facility enables us to fill that need.' As top officer of the center, Nelson receives no salary.

Director of the St. John Child Care Center is Paulette Bynum who will directly oversee the operation of the new facility.

Nelson said that, in accordance with state licensing requirements an extensive background investigation was conducted on officials of the child care center. In addition, Mrs. Bynum has been certified by the State of Department of Nevada. Human Resources Bureau of Services for Child Care as director of the facility.

A primary supporter of the project is Bally's Casino-Resort in Las Vegas where Nelson is employed as a baggage handler in the Bell Department. "I give Bally's and its Bell Department credit for their undying support which enabled us to make the center a reality," he said.

Donald Johnson, a coworker of Nelson's at Bally assisted in every phase of the project, from planning through construction. want to personally thank Mr. Johnson for giving of his time and effort to ensure that everything was followedthrough according to plans.'

Nelson concluded, "We are very proud indeed that we have been able to establish a low cost, fullservice child care center of this magnitude to take some of the burden off of some of our working parents who are striving to make ends meet.
