Mike Tyson wasted no time at Caesars Palace last Saturday in doing away with a scared Henry Tillman at 2.47 of the first round. Tillman ran from Tyson from the first sound of the bell.

By beating Tillman, Tyson avenged two prior losses as an amateur to him.
