Newly Assigned AME Church Pastor

The Reverend Emanuel Wasson, III was assigned the task of building a new congregation in the City of Las Vegas. As a result, Holy Trinity African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church was founded in the living room of the Wasson home on September 17, 1989.

As of January, Holy Trinity holds weekly worship services at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoons in the sanctuary of Mountain View Lutheran Church as a result of its outreach ministry led by the Rev. David Clark.

Rev. Wasson is assisted by his wife, Rev. Juanita V.R. Wasson, also an ordained Elder in the church. At present, Rev. Juanita, as she is fondly called, is the church musician and soloist.

For four years (1985 through 1989) Pastor Wasson served Bethel AME Church at Blithe, California. For two years Rev. Wasson commuted to help to supply the church, and for two years (until August 1989) he served as pastor while both he and his wife held full time jobs here in Las Vegas.

Pastor Wasson is a native of Mer Rouge, Louisiana. He attended Louisiana State University at Monroe, Louisiana and Central Baptist Theological Seminary at Indianapolis, Indiana.

Pastor Wasson just recently was honored as one of the Outstanding Young Men of American of 1989. His devotion to the calling of the ministry and the needs of his fellow human beings has made him known as a friend among men.

Pastor Wasson is calling for new members interested in being a part of a "grass roots" ministry, that of building a church from the beginning, and of being of service to the community. One of the great needs at this time is a musician. All are invited to share in worship at Holy Trinity.
