targeted for special racial harassment and brutality as a means of moving them off of those valuable properties.

Racism in America has always had its economic context. Now that it appears that the mayor of Michigan City, Robert Behler, wants to negotiate with members of the African American community, we believe that pershould not be sons pressured and harassed to give up their land to satisfy the greed nor the racial prejudice of others. Mayor Behler stated we need to sit down and find serious long range solutions." This mayor as well as hundreds of other mayors of cities similar to Michigan City need to understand that until the African American community as well as other racial and ethnic communities are economically empowered the problems of racial discrimination will have no short nor long term solution.

Now the city under Bheler's leadership has cocreased the rate of condominium conversions which again economically excludes the vast majority of racial and ethnic residents. This has only added to the fears of the African American community that "urban renewal" once again means "urban removal." It is a shame that the municipal leaders of Michigan City do not recognize the past contributions nor the potential of future contributions of the African American community to the benefit of the entire city.

As Chris Crawford laid dying in the streets of Michigan City, the local police present at the scene did not immediately call the ambulance because they didn't care about the life that they had already concluded was worthless and useless in a city that had become racially polarized. Police Chief Larry Kunzel defended police the department because the policeman assumed that Crawford was already dead and instead they called the coroner.


In America no one should be left to die in the street. Unfortunately, assumptions about life and death are colored by racial prejudice. Justice must be demanded in Michigan City, Indiana and the economics of racism must not go unchallenged.
