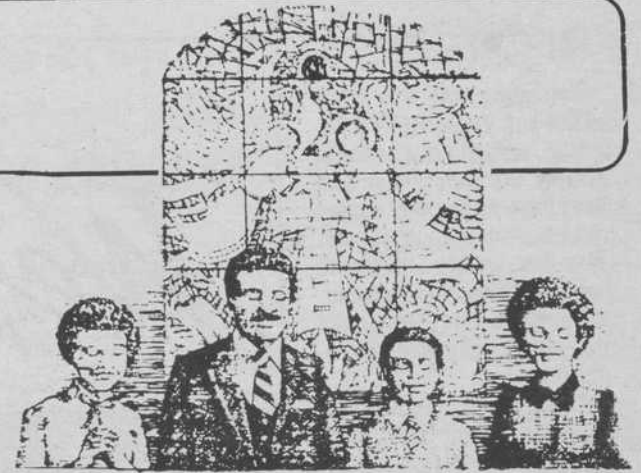

BIBLICAL INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

"Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands" --
Psalm 100.1

1. *What kind of noise do you make?* So many of us cry out in pain and in self-pity--when we could easily--and more profitably...cry out in ecstasy and affirmation, making "a joyful noise to the Lord."

When nobody else stands by us, we can see Jesus all the more clearly. When night is darkest, we know the dawn approaches. Why then, do we fret and fume? "Make a joyful noise!" Let God's name be praised.

2. *Praise changes things.* Not only before God, but among our friends we should recognize the need to "make a joyful noise." It is said that self-hatred is often characteristic of those who see themselves as oppressed. Yet it may be our own self-hatred and our low self-esteem that further oppresses us, and which causes us to place a low estimate upon others.

Praise, we should all know, changes things. We must have a high view of what we are in God's sight - and by God's grace. We must also know that our loved ones will always love us better--infinitely better--when they hear praise rising from our lips and hearts. Praise changes things.

Praise changes things.

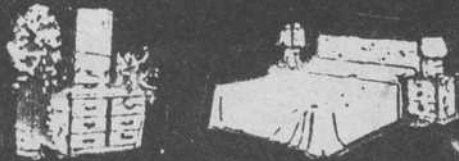
