multi-talented in athletics and music, he proved himself a winner in his teen years by appearing on Ted Mack's Amateur Hour and winning the competition. Going on to college in North Carolina to continue his education, Louis met his wife of 37 years, Khadijah.

Minister Farrakhan's first exposure to the Nation of Islam came in Chicago, February 1955, at the Savior's Day Convention. The Honorable Elijah Mohammad was the speaker that evening and conveyed a powerful enough message that Louis and his wife joined right on the spot.

Coming up through the ranks, first as a captain of the FOI (Fruit of Islam), he was appointed the minister of the Roxbury Temple in one year after his acceptance of the faith. For close to 10 years he held that position before being reassigned to a more prominent position, that being the replacement of

Malcolm X at the Harlem mosque.

Literally millions of listeners have attended Minister Farrakhan's lectures since his resurgence of the Nation of Islam. Blacks, for the most part, are attracted to the minister because of his emphasis on Black pride and insistence on Blacks empowering themselves economically by supporting Black business. As a national leader, Minister Farrakhan has united many Blacks together to form a strong community life.

In 1989, Minister Farrakhan began a very special lecture tour to deliver a message to Black youth titled "Stop the Killings." This same topic is being directed to our youth here in Clark County. What he has charged is that the U.S. government is waging an assault on the Black Community under the guise of a War on Drugs.
