(Continued from Page 2) and young people - by our own example-that keeping informed and voting are essential in a democratic society. An extensive study of 15-20-year-olds last year found that most young people have only a fuzzy idea of what makes a good citizen. Sixty percent said they know "just some" or "very little" about the way our government works. And 57 percent said they have "just some" or "very little" interest in following politics and government by reading the newspaper or watching the news on television. Only 12 percent of those who were interviewed volun-

teered that "voting" is basic to citizenship. And only half said their school had an "active" program to register students to vote.

A large majority of these same students (70 percent) said their parents - not celebrities or peers - have had the greatest impact on their thinking about citizenship. Teachers were second at 21 percent.

So if you are a parent, your vote counts - in more ways than one. Your vote is needed to make sure that children and families have first call on the nation's resources. Your vote also is needed to teach children by example to become thoughtful,


