employment. Some of the current sociological data seems to indicate that the lack of self-esteem and sense of accomplishment tend to be some of the contributing factors that lead our youth to participate in illicit activities such as gangs and drugs.

There is no more swift, lasting or common denominator of interest among our youth than sports. The sports program is in essence a "holding Power" creatively geared to involve a participant for a span of time deemed necessary by the program. DOC BROADUS YOUTH SPORTS, Inc. is a non-profit sports program and is established to give the youth of this community an opportunity to take part in a supervised program of sports and counseling.

With the focus on the encouragement of systemic sports and education, the objectives are:

1. To provide youth with highly developed and specialized sports skills; opportunities to compete against opposition which will challenge their interest and furnish an outlet for sports competition at their skill level.

2. To contribute to the development of individual and team spirit, and program loyalty.

3. To provide opportunities for the wholesome use of leisure time.

4. To provide opportunities for positive social contacts.

5. To provide a wide variety of sports activities which will provide opportunities for year round participation in sports.

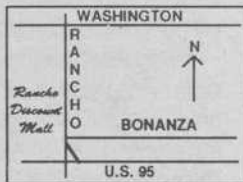
6. To provide supportive counseling to focus on:
