public safety," Robinson, who chairs the North Las Vegas Crime Prevention Task Force, said. "The new jail will reduce the criminal element by enabling our police officials to incarcerate those who deserves to be locked up, such as gang members and drug dealers who terrorize our citizens."

In addition to his active commitment to enhancing increased police protection, Robinson said he will work to improve living conditions, expand economic development and stimulate neighborhood revitalization in North Las Vegas.

"Our present City Council has made a big difference in laying the foundation for and encouraging quality growth for our city," he stated. "We must continue to provide the services that our growing citizenry demands without placing an undue burden on

our taxpayers."

Robinson added that he will work for more social and athletic programs to benefit children and senior citizens in North Las Vegas.

"The time is now to provide for the safety of our families and the future of North Las Vegas," he said.

A school success monitor for 24 years with the Clark County School District, Robinson has served as chairman on a number of boards and committees, including the Library, Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, the Real Property Advisory Committee, and the Housing Authority.

He was named North Las Vegas Public Official of the Year in 1989 and serves on the board of directors for the North Las Vegas Democratic Club. Robinson is an honorary director of the North Las Vegas Chamber of

Commerce and a member of both the Clark County Board of Health and the Environmental Quality Policy Review Board. He also serves as an alternate member of Nevada Development Authority and the Economic Opportunity Board.

Robinson was a volunteer Pop Warner football coach for six years and has been recognized by Who's Who as being among the Outstanding Young Men of America. He has served as chairman of the Nevada League of Cities and is a committee member of the National League of Cities and is a committee member of the National League of Cities for Community and Economic Development. Robinson was both chaplain and national director of Nevada Jaycees and is also a life member and J.C.I. senator of the U.S. and International Jaycees.
