

Allah (Most High) says in the Holy Quran: 2:177: "It is not righteousness that you turn your faces to the east or west, but it is righteousness to believe in Allah and the Last Day, and the Angels, and the Book and the Messengers; to spend of "your wealth in spite of your love of it. for your relative, for orphans, for the needy, for the wayfarer, for those who ask, and for the ransom of slaves; to be steadfast in prayer (Salat) and practice regular charity, to fulfill all contracts which you have made, and to be firm and patient in pain (or suffering) and adversity, and throughout all periods of panic - such are the people of truth, the God-fearing."

When the Muslims stand for prayer (Salat), they face the northeast, the direction of the Ka'abah, the first House of Worship of Allah built by Abraham (Ibrahim), (see Quran 2:125:127).But Allah clearly rejects the turning of individuals to the east or west as an indicator of righteousness. Allah, in the Holy Quran stresses to us that the mere compliance with the

bending and bowing), does not fulfill the requirement of righteousness

Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) said: "Many of you stay up all night in prayer (Salat) and your only gain is tired, fatigue and sore muscles." Why? You are only following the ritual with no substance.

What is even more hypocritical are people who profess to be Muslim an fail or refuse to pray (offer Salat), five times per day, or even once per day and never attend Juma (the Friday Gathering), at all. What a shame!

So, in returning to our theme, we see that Allah (Most High) in the Holy Quran and His Messenger Muhammad (PBUH), reject the outward ritual or act of turning one's face in a certain direction as righteous.

The first standards of "righteousness" for Muslims are described in the Holy Quran as: (1) Belief in Allah (see Quran 4:125 and 12:67), (2) Belief in the Last Day (the Resurrection and Judgement), (see Quran 6:51, 6:128, 20:102-104), (3) Belief in the Angels (see Quran 21:26, 66:6, 35:1, 4:136), (4) Belief in the Books: (Book of Abraham, Torah, Psalms, Gospel and Quran, Precious Books 3:3, 5:46-48, 61:6, (5) Belief in the Prophets (see Quran 2:285, 10:47, 13:7, 35:24, 40:78); The Holy Quran presents all the Prophets of Allah as honorable righteous men and Muslims must respect them all "We make no distinction (they say), between one and another of His Messengers (2:285 also see 2:253).

beliefs in Al-Qadr, the Divine Decree or that which is pre-ordained make up what we call the Principles of Al-Islam or the Islamic Belief/Faith System.

The belief in that which is beyond our five senses is a prerequisite to Faith (Iman) in: "And who believe in that which is beyond the reach of human perception." 2:3, "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, and the evidence of things not seen." Bible

We continue this presentation of "Righteousness: the Islamic Perspective" from Sura (Chapter 2, Ayat [verse] 1771), with the actions that indicate righteousness. For where there is Belief (Faith) there must be actions that reflect our faith, "Verily mankind is lost, except those who have Faith (believe), and do righteous deeds (actions): Quran 103:2-3.

Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) said: "Faith and actions (righteous deeds) are synonymous with a garden and a stream or river. Just as the garden is nurtured by the water of the stream of river, so is faith nurtured by righteous deeds (actions).

These righteous deeds in 2:177 include: "to spend of your substance, in spite of your love for it, for your kin (relatives), for orphans, for the needy, for the wayfarer, for those who ask, and for the ransom of slaves."

So, Allah (Most High) commands and prioritizes the order of our charity, and we are admonished to forego - both our religious leaders and their followers - the practice of selfish

expensive cars, clothing, jewelry, televisions (3-4 per household), videos, drugs and alcohol, partying ... all the while claiming to be righteous.

Our government spends more on military build-up and defense than for social programs, education and health, but l occasionally wonder why the federal or state government should take care of our needs while we neglect them for our wants (pleasures). (see Quran 90:10-17)

Among those whom Allah (Most High) commands us to send our wealth on is for the freeing of slaves. By including this kind of spending within the requirements of righteousness, the Holy Quran suggests that the freeing of people from bondage (slavery) was, and continues to be, one of the social, political and cultural objectives of Al-Islam (see 8:67, 4:92, 5: 89. 58:3).

And righteousness in 2:177 is, "To be steadfast in prayer and practice regular charity, to fulfill all contracts which you have made; and to be firm and patient in pain or (suffering) and adversity, and throughout all periods of panic. Such are people of truth, the God-fearing." Again being steadfast in prayer (Salat) is a standard of righteousness (see Quran 2:110, 2:238).

Practice of regular charity demonstrates what many individuals say in words, but fail in actions. Then there are those who spend in times of plenty, but refuse to spend in times of ad-(See Islamic, Page 7)
