Hansel, who had been on "LASIX" in all of his races since bleeding in the "Fountain of Youth" stakes in February, was called upon to run in the Preakness without the use of "LASIX."

Some of the "Purists" in horse racing swear that LASIX enhances a horse's performance and that the medication should be banned completely in the horse racing industry.

The purists fail to realize that "claiming races" make up 2/3 of a daily racing card at most major race tracks.

These "claiming horses" are the horses that really need LASIX.

With Hansel's win in the Preakness without the use of LASIX, the purists may use this race in order to justify the banning of the drug completely in

racing.

On Sunday, June 9th, four fillies went to post for the running of the "Fantasy Stakes." Two of those fillies were named "LITE LIGHT" and "MEADOW STAR." Meadow Star had only one loss in her racing career.

Look for these two outstanding fillies to battle again when they meet in the "Breeders Cup" race in November of this year.

**49ERS' PIERCE HOLT WINS PRO FOOTBALL ARM WRESTLING TITLE AT IMPERIAL PALACE**
