RELIGIOUS PEOPLE ORGANIZE FOR CIVIL RIGHTS

Awards Dinner To Be Held

Senator Ted Kennedy (D-Mass) and James Jeffords (R-Vt), co-sponsors of the 1990 Civil Rights Bill, join Representatives William Gray (D-Pa.), James Leach (R-Iowa), and John Lewis (D-Ga.), all sponsor of the 1991 House Civil Rights Bill, HRI, as congressional chairs of a national pro-civil rights dinner in Washington on September 19, 1991. The event is sponsored by INTERFAITH IMPACT for Justice and Peace, the religious

advocacy and education voice on Capital Hill.

Elenora Giddings Ivory, chair of the board, noted "the dinner will provide a climactic rally for the year-long commitment of many national religious groups to securing passage of a new Civil Rights Bill to strengthen equal opportunity in the work place for women and minorities."

Underlining the religious and interfaith support for civil rights, the dinner's national chair persons include Mr. Lane Kirkland,

AFL-CIO president; the Rev. Joan B. Campbell; General Secretary of the National Council of Churches; Mr. Joseph Rauh, Washington, D.C. attorney; and Imam Jamil At-Amin of Atlanta, American Muslim Council, along with Dr. Dorothy Height, Executive Director, National Council of Negro Women, and Senator Barbara Mikulski (D-Md.)

Dr. Betty Coats of the Episcopal Church and chair of the event said, "We need some in-

spiration to remind us of our past gains in civil rights and point us where we still need to go: let's rally our energies to get the Civil Rights Act passed!"

One of the honorees will be Ben Chavis of the United Church of Christ. Ivory said "many of our friends beyond Washington will plan their autumn work and travel to be here September 19th and help make this awards celebration a powerful show of faith and enthusiasm for strengthening civil rights."

The dinner will take place at the Shiloh Baptist Church in Washington, D.C. a historic Black congregation which served as one of the staging churches for the 1963 Civil Rights march. Barbara Edmondson at INTERFAITH IMPACT is taking reservations, contributions, and support advertisement for the event's printed program (202) 543-2800.
