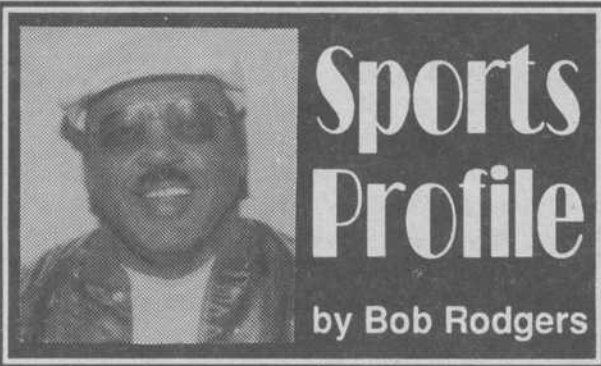

Mike Tyson Wins Unanimous Decision Over "Razor" Ruddock In Rematch At The Mirage

"Mighty" Mike Tyson had to go the full 12 rounds to win an easy decision from Jamaican Donovan "Razor" Ruddock.

There was no secret that Tyson was out for a knockout in this fight, but referee Mills Lane allowed Ruddock, the bigger of the two fighter, to hold on for clinch after clinch, as he could not force the two apart so Tyson could finish him off.

By the end of the fight, Ruddock (25-3) had suffered a broken jaw.

One judge scored the fight 113-109, while the other two had it 114-108 in favor of Tyson, who may take on George Foreman in November.

"Fast" Eddie Cook, a young

Two times Vasquez was penalized points for low blows by referee Toby Gibson.

Had he been penalized for low blow once more in the round he would have automatically lost the fight.

For Cook there are no immediate plans for a world title fight, but he is willing to wait his turn.
