Over 35,000 racing fans were in attendance at Hollywood Park to watch the running of the 52nd Hollywood Gold Cup. This race was being billed as a match race between Farma Way and Summer Squall, the 1990 Preakness winner. On May 11, Farma Way had defeated Summer Squall by 3 lengths in the Pimlico Special." Since that time Summer Squall won an allowance race at Churchill Downs and gained valuable seasoning. On June 8, in the Nassau County Handicap, Farma Way hooked up in a blazing speed duel with Jolie's Halo and finished third to Festin. After that race D. Wayne Lukas publicly critized Gary Stevens for the way he rode Farma Way and announced that Chris McCarron would be riding Farma Way in the Gold Cup on June 29.

The Gold Cup was the sixth in the 10-race American Championship Racing Series which has \$1.5 million dollars in bonus money to the four horses with the most points. Festin is the series leader with 30 points but trainer Ron McAnally decided to skip this race and ship Festin East.

The Hollywood Gold Cup was a 1 1/4 mile race on dirt and had a purse of \$1 million. The winner of this race would earn \$550,000.

Farma Way has earned over \$1.4 million this year and had captured five stake races. Summer Squall came into this race with lifetime earnings of \$1.7 million dollars. Since Wayne Lukas won the Gold Cup'last year with Criminal Type, he would join a group of four men to win this race back-to-back.

Lukas had stated that Summer Squall was their major threat.

Few of the racing fans gave Marquetry much of a chance of winning this race since he was sent off at 27 to 1 odds. It was
