## RESOLUTION SUBMITTED UNDER ARTICLE X, SECTION 2 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE NAACP 1991 - PART III

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

#### 1. Benefits of the Tourism Industry Approved

WHEREAS, the tourism industry is one of the most rapidly growing industries in a number of areas in the United States. It profits significantly from the employment of African-Americans at very low wages and little or no fringe benefits. It further profits from the African-American community because we too spend our money at these resorts during vacations and conventions. It often causes increased tax bases that result from development in a given location. Developer often show a complete disregard for the African-American culture by destroying our cemeteries for golf courses or other constructions;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the National

Board of Directors, State Conferences and Branches closely monitor the impact of U.S. tourism, take whatever action necessary to ensure that African-Americans benefit economically and socially, and that their quality of life is in no way inhibited by it.

#### 2. Economic Slowdown and Its Impact on the African-American Community Approved

WHEREAS, research findings confirm the historical fact that African-Americans are the last hired and first fired; and

WHEREAS, such a reality is all the more acute during periods of economic downturns; and,

WHEREAS, there is some element of truth in the observation once made by President Kennedy that a high tide lifts all boats; and,

WHEREAS, local branches continue to report sharp increases in the number and variety of complaints being received which allege discrimination in job dismissals, layoffs, furloughs and reassignments; and,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that all regions of the NAACP call upon its branches, youth and college divisions, and state conferences (See the NAACP, Page 17)
