

An evening of sports trivia will fill the air, as honors are given to UNLV coach Jerry Tarkanian (Merit Award) and to Sarann Knight-Preddy and Al Jordan (Community Service Award) who have worked on the behalf of youth for so many years in Las Vegas.

High School athletes Antonio Jackson of Las Vegas High, and Rae Hartwell of Western will also be honored for their scholastic and athletic achievement City Councilman Frank Hawkins will make a special presentation on behalf of Major Jan Laverty-Jones, and other awards will be presented by a representative of Governor Bob Miller, and other elected officials.

This is something that is long overdue. It is something that all young people should be allowed to attend so they can meet these people," said Knight. Not only are those being honored successful in sports, they are successful in other aspects of life, this all transcends into a positive person," she added.
