NAACP Summit Conference Held

The Las Vegas and Reno/Sparks branches of the NAACP cosponsored a Mid-State Summit Conference, Friday, and Saturday, February 21-22, 1992 in Tonapah, Nevada.

This Summit Conference dealt with the following agenda items, namely; Political and Economic Empowerment, Voter Registration, Voter Education, The Print and Electronic Media and general NAACP Programtic Thrust.

The Summit began with a reception Friday night in the convention area of the Station House Hotel. During the reception one invited guest appeared in the person of Attorney Richard Segreblom State Chairmen of the Democratic Party who was subsequently followed by Mr. Ken Sawyer the Republican State Chairman of Nevada. Questions were asked of both chairman. Since they had not done anything for Black Voters, why should Blacks vote for either party. Neither chairman had much to offer as evidence. Further questions were what had either Party done to encourage Blacks to run for local and Statewide offices with party financial and strategic assistance. In the main, their answers were unacceptable to the assembled delegates. The reception ended with each chairman promising to extend the hand of welcome to Blacks in Nevada.

On Saturday the Summit began with breakfast, and at 9:00 a.m. the scheduled workshops began.

At the end of the workshops, a series of resolutions were discussed and adopted for further programmatic activities of the State Conference such as: Blacks should spend their monies only where they can work and where their dollars are re-invested in their community.

The initiation and development of a program that would prevent and discourage young Black men and women from getting into the Nevada Criminal Justice System.

To insist all statewide media portray the big picture of Blacks by balancing the news both good and bad.

To discourage several Blacks from running and competing for the same political position.

To encourage every one to register and to vote on election day and to become a member of the NAACP.

The Summit ended with a Banquet on Saturday night.
