MARCUS AURELIUS GARVEY

Marcus A. Garvey was born August 17, 1887 at St. Ann's Bay Jamaica. Marcus's family was poor and couldn't afford to send him to school for a formal education, therefore, at age fourteen Marcus became an apprentice at a printing house.

When Mr. Garvey was seventeen he went to Kingston to work as a printer. While in Kingston, Garvey enjoyed street debates and the large crowds of people. Eventually he became skilled enough to address groups himself. After becoming very popular at speak-

ing, Garvey began to publish his own literature. Garvey published a paper called *Garvey's Watchman*, and helped to establish other publications as he traveled to Ecuador, Nicaragua, Honduras, Columbia and Venezuela, always concerning himself with the working conditions of Blacks in particular.

Mr. Garvey traveled to England in 1912 and quickly joined forces with African students who were fighting for their equal rights. While in London, Garvey discovered Booker T. Washington's book "Up From Slavery" which made a profound impression on him. Garvey said that it was Washington's book that made him ask "Where is the black man's government?" Marcus Garvey wrote to Booker T. Washington in 1915, and he responded by saying he would be helpful if possible. However, by the time Garvey arrived in march of

1916, Washington was dead. The newly appointed Tuskegee president Moton was not interested in what Garvey was about, so Garvey set about establishing the Black man's government.

Marcus Garvey organized several organizations including; Black Cross Nurses, The Black Motor Corp. The African Legions, The Black Star Line (which would take thousands of Black Americans to Africa) and saw himself as the spiritual leader for a new African government. Garvey was able to obtain several ships for his mass return as well as over 9 million dollars. Former members of the UNIA charged him with fraud. Eventually he was convicted and sentenced to 5 yrs in prison and fined \$1,000. Garvey appealed the conviction, but lost, however, President Coolidge did pardon Garvey. He was deported in 1927.

All labor in the project shall be paid no less than the minimum wage rates established by the U.S. Secretary of Labor and the State of Nevada.

Each Bidder must supply all the information required by the bid documents and specifications.

The EEO requirements, labor provisions and wage rates are included in the specifications and bid documents and are available for inspection at the Office of the Clark County Director of General Services, Purchasing Division, Bridger Building, Tenth Floor, 225 Bridger Avenue, Las Vegas, Nevada.

Each Bidder must complete, sign and furnish prior to award of the Contract, the "Bidder's Statement on Previous Contracts Subject to EEO Clause", a "Certification of Nonsegregated Facilities", and the "Assurance of Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Participation" as contained in the Bid Proposal.

A Bidder having 50 or more employees and its Subcontractors having 50 or more employees and who may be awarded a Contract of \$50,000.00 or more will be required to maintain an affirmative action program, the standards for which are contained in the specifications.

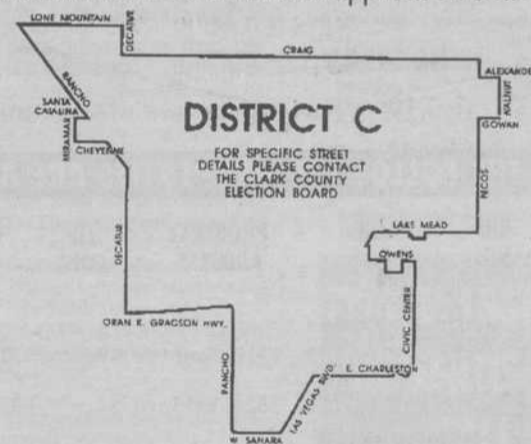
