We encourage couples of all nationalities to visit our agency and to become more acquainted with the services offered here.

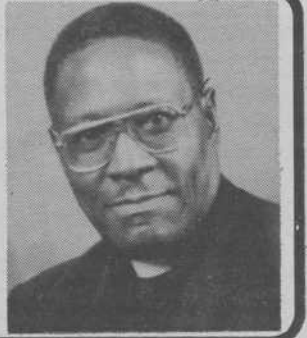

The Following Is Part One Of A Four Part Series Written By Dr. Benjamin L. Hooks, Executive Director, NAACP

INTRODUCTION TO ANNUAL REPORT PART-1

I am pleased to submit to the corporate membership of the NAACP, this my fifteenth annual report on the state of the Association. First, however, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of our National Board of Directors, SCF Trustees and members of our hard working staff for their invaluable help and support.

Of course, none of what we were able to do would have been possible without the tireless efforts and inestimable sacrifices by the brave men and women who provide this institution with the day-to-day leadership of our units lung from one coast of this continent to the other. For it is the NAACP volunteer leadership that has successfully kept this Association going during good times and bad times, through economic upswings and downturns, through storms of racial conflict and controversy, and through the sunlight of racial tranquility and harmony. In a real sense, the NAACP's secret weapon is our vast cadre of loyal, dedicated and committed volunteers who give their time and talents without remuneration or, for that matter, without appreciation by those whose work benefits the most.

We have been fortunate to have had down through the years people who have agreed to hold office in our branches and youth units who brought various levels of expertise to leadership position. Many have served as officers, others as chairmen of one of our committees, and still others just as faithful members who sell the memberships and freedom fund tickets; investigate housing, education or employment discrimination complaints; persons who marched in our demonstrations or write letters and circulate petitions—all in their own way making a meaningful contribution to the struggle for equality. Our volunteers cover the spectrum.
