We certainly did not want to see the same thing happen again, or to anybody else. That's why we took the time to tell the public at large about the way Mr. Watson and his Cal/Tex Rodeo

scam operated, and hopefully through our warnings folks would be aware and steer clear of any Cal/Tex Rodeo promotion offer or opportunity being offered them, regardless of how good the offer may have sounded. Then in January we published the news that the same Mr. James Watson, CEO of Cal/Tex Rodeo Productions, had been arrested by the Bunko and Forery Division of Los Angeles Police Department's Major Section, and his bail had been set at \$1 million dollars behind his rodeo promotion scams and other bogus money taking ideas revolving around his Cal/Tex Rodeo Promotions.

Unfortunately or for whatever unexplainable reason, and in spite of warnings, the Central Texas Sickle Cell Anemia Association fell victim to another Cal/ Tex Rodeo scam this past February. Unfortunately too, another black eye was given 'black rodeo promotions' by the unscrupulous doings of a smooth operating con man who promises everything and gives nothing! It's also unfortunate this latest 'rip off of blacks folks had

to come during a month desig-
