"The Great White Hope" is fictionalization about the life of Jack Johnson. Written by Howard Sackler it was performed by the New West Theatre and directed by Brian Strom.

Jack Johnson was one of several Black fighters in the early nineteen hundreds. During those times, Blacks were not allowed to fight in the White divisions. They would fight among themselves. It appears that prize fighting was a very lucrative profession, even then.

Jack had a lot of style and class. He was admired by many for his boldness. It was said that back in 1898 when Jack had his first professional fight he was fearless. Not only did he capture the crowd with his great fighting skills, but also with charm. Jack was a very stylish dresser and spent most of his time, when he wasn't training, with high class women of illrepute. He was the owner of a bar and a advertisement company. He used his company, which didn't stay in business long to promote himself.


Jack, being a little ahead of his time, wanted more. He wanted to fight in the White heavyweight division. Tommy Burns at the time was the White heavyweight champion. He refused to fight Blacks and especially Jack Johnson. Thus Jack followed Tommy all over the world taunting him. Finally Tommy gave in due to pressure from the public. The fight was on. The fight of the century took place in Sydney, Australia, December 26, 1908. Jack Johnson was crowned the heavyweight champion of the world. You can imagine what a ruckus that created.

The sole purpose of the fight was to put the nigger back into his place. Jack's winning of that fight caused race riots all over the country. Many Blacks were killed as well as lynched.
