search of the "Great White Hope." It's from that slogan the play got it's name. The promoter and the public forced Jim Jeffries out of retirement. The fight was set to take place in our fair state in the town of Reno, July 4, 1910. This was the White mans only hopeof getting the heavyweight title back.

The play opens up at the scene of Brady's farm with Jack Jefferson who is the fictional character of Jim Jeffries. The show was exceptionally cast, Jack Jefferson, the fictional name for Jack Johnson was brilliantly played by David Cousin. The show moved and kept the audiences attention. The racial slurs hit hard and hit home. We are not far from the early 1900's except we now are experiencing Neo-Racism. The play was portrayed very realistic and at times I felt that I was exactly there. Brian Strom and his cast did an excellent performance. Jack Johnson died in 1946 in a car accident. Randy Roberts wrote a book about Jack called "Papa Jack." In Jack's own words, "stick around baby and never call me Daddy!"
