The recent rise in shootings within Las Vegas' Black community has once again taken it's toll, as three teenage young men have died within three days this week.

On Monday, a 16-year-old North Las Vegan was shot, and later died after reportedly fleeing a gas station in a stolen car at Martin Luther King Boulevard and Bonanza.

It was reported that Michael McCraney (16) struck Thomas Williams (19) with a handgun, and fled in the vehicle. Police later found him shot on North J Street, where he had run into a fire hydrant. Police had originally considered the fact that McCraney may have shot himself, but they later discovered that a man was seen shooting him. Investigators have said that several people may know who the killer is, but are reluctant to step forward. The killer is listed as a 6'1" slender Black male in his late teens.

Two nights later, on Wednesday, an 18-yearold male was killed in an apparent drive-by shooting near the corner of Washington Boulevard and Tonopah.

The victim was shot at approximately 6:00 p.m. after stepping out of an apartment in the 2000 block of West Washington. As he walked outside, his assailant, driving in a grey car, fired approximately six shots at the teen.

Police were told by witnesses that the attack was gang related and that the slain man was a known gang member. At press time, no arrests had been made.

Shortly after that incident, approximately one mile away on Cindysue St., another teen was reportedly killed in what police believe may have been in retaliation to the earlier murder.

Details were sketchy, and apparently no arrests were made in this incident as well.
