The 1992 NCAA tournament is rollin' along just fine these days. At press time, the East regional semi-finals were in full effect as No. 2 Kentucky and No. 3 Massachusetts tipped-off with top-seeded Duke and No. 4 Seton Hall to follow. Can anyone stop Duke? The same question was being asked last year about UNLV and we know how that scenario went. The Blue Devils should top Seton Hall and will, most likely, face Kentucky in the East Regional Final.

Also at press time, the West region was set to kick off it's semifinals pitting No. 2 Indiana against No. 3 Florida St. while No. 1 UCLA and No. 12 New Mexico St. waited in the wings. UNLV - NOT!!! That is what they're saying in New Mexico, where the regional finals are being played. After dominating the Big West for ten years and the NCAA for the past two, UNLV isn't the only team, from the Big West Conference, making noise anymore. Unfortunately, New Mexico St. will face their toughest challenge in UCLA. Watch for the Bruins and



Indiana to tip-off Saturday in the West Regional Final.

Finally in the Southeast we have No.1 Ohio St. and No. 4 North Carolina set to do battle and No. 2 Oklahoma St. facing freshman ridden Michigan, the No. 6 seed, in the nightcap. The Wolverines' five frosh got by temple and East Tennessee St. and now find themselves in their toughest match-up, since facing Duke earlier this season, against the Cowboys. Okie St. has choked excessively during the second-half of the season and just might be ready to cough-up one more time.

Local expert B.D. Williams still finds Duke and Ohio St. battling for the national championship. And the winner is... see ya next week.

## Larry Johnson Receives Honor

NEW YORK - Rookie Larry Johnson of the Charlotte Hornets, who averaged 27.8 point, 12 rebounds and 6.8 assists per game last week, was named NBA Player of the Week on Monday.

Johnson, the former UNLV star who was the No. 1 pick in the 1991 draft, led the Hornets to a 3-1 record last week. They also have won 10 of their last 13.Johnson shot .561 (46 of 82) from the field last week.



He is averaging 19.3 points per game, the best among rookies. He also is averaging 11.4 rebounds, ninth in the league.
