The King Committee was founded in 1981, and is an official support group of the Martin Luther King Center for Non-violent and Social Change, based in Atlanta, Georgia. services to the elderly and community and domestic violence. April 4th Memorial Service & Rally for Organized Labor

On April 4th, 1992 the King Committee will observe the 24th anniversary of the murder of Dr. King. A 2:00 p.m. memorial service will be held at the Victory Baptist Church located at 500 Monroe St. Because of Dr. King's strong position in support of organized labor and the fact that he was killed while leading a struggle on behalf of striking garbage workers in Memphis

when he was killed; following the church service, there will be a rally on the church grounds in support of organized labor. The rally is co-sponsored by the Culinary Workers Union, Local 226 who is currently on strike at the Frontier Hotel. Memorial service chairperson is Joanna Wesley-Lee.

Scholarships Now Available

The scholarship committee is now ready to award a total of \$15,000 in educational assistance to students here locally. The King Committee will be offering five \$1,000 scholarships, one \$4,000 scholarship, three \$500 scholarships and 10 \$250 scholarships to graduating seniors in all areas of study.

In addition, the committee will award two \$500 scholarships to single parents to assist in seek-

ing higher educational goals.
