SHARK'S SPURS

TARKANIAN HEADED FOR SAN ANTONIO

The San Antonio Spurs announced, this past Wednesday, that Jerry Tarkanian has been signed as the new Head Coach of the Spurs. Tarkanian-who signed a multi-year deal with the Spurs-will not take over coaching duties of the team until the 1991-92 season is over.

"I really like the players on this team," said Tarkanian in a 2:00p.m. press conference at the Spurs office. "I hope I can come in here and get the running game going in San Antonio and make the Spurs the Runnin' Spurs. I like this team very, very much. And I'm real excited to be here. Hopefully we can put everything together here and have some great seasons. The Spurs have the potential to be an outstanding team."

Tarkanian comes to the Spurs from the college ranks,

spending the last 19 seasons here at UNLV. He established himself as one of the best coaches in NCAA history, putting together a 509-105 record at UNLV. In the 1989-90 season the Shark brought UNLV college basketball's ultimate award, winning the NCAA Championship game.

Overall Tark spent 24 seasons coaching at the Division I level, posting a 625-122 record during that time. And his winning percentage of .837 is the best in NCAA history. In his 24 seasons at the Division I level, Tarkanian took his teams to post-season play 16 times, including three trips to the NCAA Final Four.

"This is a significant step for our franchise," said Spurs owner Red McCombs. "Jerry Tarkanian's coaching record is unequaled. But to me, equally important, is the fact that Coach Tark really wanted to coach this team. He knows something about the spirit that we have here in San Antonio as it is similar to the kind of involvement that he and his family had in Las Vegas. I can't tell you how elated I am that we have Tark. He is a great coach and a great human being."

The 61 year-old Tarkanian has been a head coach in the college ranks for 31 years and has an overall record of 837-158. Before going to UNLV he spent five seasons at Long Beach St. and seven seasons in the junior college ranks, at Pasadena City College and Riverside City College. In his seven seasons at the junior college level the Tark was 212-28 for a .891 percentage, which is the best percentage in history at that level. In his 31 years Tark's

teams have reached the 20-win mark 29 times and never in his 31 years has one of his teams turned in a losing season.

It has been speculated that Tarkanian signed a two-year contract with the option for a third. The Shark should make, at least, 2-3 times as much as he was making at UNLV.
