HELPFUL HINTS:

1. One way rentals are permitted and the drop off cost is usually based on actual cost to return the unit to the point of origin.
2. Housekeeping kits are available to rent and the cost is usually \$25.00 per person. (Includes: Linens, Cookware, Utensils, Towels, Blankets, Etc.)
3. Collision protection coverage can be purchased for an additional fee to waive the deductible on any accident.
4. KOA Kampground Discount Value Kard and directories are available with atlas and camping guide. Write: KOA Value Kard; P.O. Box 31734D; Billings, MT 59107-1734
5. Allow at least 45 minutes for motor home familiarization tour at check-out. Allow 20 minutes for check-in.
6. Test ride should be requested for first time motor home renter.
7. Special authorization and insurance is required for travel into

Mexico and Canada.

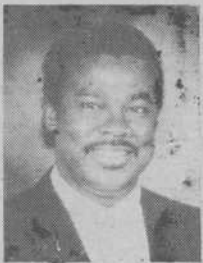
8. Advance planning can help avoid pitfalls and cut expenses. Consider time when mapping out a route. As a rule, scenic routes are more time-consuming than interstates.

9. During the summer months, national camp areas are usually full, it is advisable to make advance reservations. In some states, reservations can be made through Ticketron.
