Dr. Linda Young makes no bones about being totally bullish in education. The veteran educator is president of the Las Vegas Alliance of Black School Educators (LVABSE), a group dedicated to helping Black youth in particular, and all children, realize their full educational potential

LVABSE is currently party to a major class action lawsuit against the Clark County School District. The lawsuit, alleging across-the-board discrimination, is being appealed at this time to the Nonth Circuit Court of Ap-

peals in San Francisco. The suit, on behalf of Black parents, students, educators and school district employees, seeks to remedy past and present discriminatory practices which LVABSE alleges continue to plaque the system.

"That discrimination exists in

our school system should be apparent to anyone who knows anything however remote about the district," Young said. Young, Director of Special Education Programs, stresses that as an employee of the district she has even more reason to want the system to change for the better.
