along with other looters. On Friday after leaving the community meeting at New Jerusalem Church, we left for Zion Methodist Church to meet with the gang members. Before reaching "H" and Owens, Streets, the 1st. of three cars with young African American men in them were stopped by Metro. No less than eight Metro officers would stop each of the three cars. The Metro officers would all stand around with their rifles drawn in every direction as

if they were in a war zone. This

was very insulting to the young

ing. One car of men had 12 officers with drawn guns on them. Fortunately, Commissioner Pearson observed these officers and called Sheriff Moran from his car to call off the officers because those young people had just left the 1st church meeting.

This is the kind of behavior that keeps tension in our community. Those of us that observed these incidents could understand the outrage of our young people. We can no longer blame the gangs; we must look at ourselves and come up with some positive solutions for all people. The gang members

were willing to give up their lives to say enough is enough. It was the Sentiment of the majority to have a Boycott of non-Black Businesses; we must eat at Black

owned Restaurants, shop at Black owned stores. This must be done to make a full impact. For more information con-
