AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY REV. JESSE "MA" HOUSTON (Prison Mission Pioneer)

was born in Blackman, LA in 1899 and reared in Arkansas "Ma" Houston was stricken with polio at an early age; and spent most of her childhood in wheelchairs and on crutches. In 1925 she and her husband



GWEN WALKER moved to Chicago and she began her writing to lonely servicemen although a semi-invalid.

When one of them was put in jail she visited him, thus her prison mission started and lasted over 50 years.

"Ma" Houston was a welcomed sight in many Illinois prisons spreading hope and courage to the inmates. She was the "First" woman allowed to minister to prisoners on Death Row in Illinois.Rev. "Ma" Houston touched so many with kindness, counseling and hope. She helped the prison outpost of operation breadbasket which later became "PUSH."

She served on the Governors' correctional advisory panel of Illinois. She died in 1980.



In memory of her crusade to help others, a center was named in her honor (Sept 10. 1980). Her physical handicap did not deter her devotion to ministering to prison-
